1400: From the Vault: [Podcaster's website](#) ; [Underwriter website](#) This week on From the Vault we present one of Pacifica Radio's newly-restored audio treasures, rediscovered' during preservation work funded by our most recent National Endowment for the Arts grant. This 1964 recording, fittingly titled A Poetry Reading, features Gwendolyn Brooks and LeRoi Jones and is as historically significant as any

recording in the Pacifica Radio Archives collection. Gwendolyn Brooks delivers a remarkable performance, reading a range from her earliest work (A Street in Bronzeville, 1945) to her Pulitzer Prize-winning collection (Annie Allen, 1950) to her most current prose that year of 1964. LeRoi Jones reminds us of his roots in the Beat Generation and his talent as a Greenwich Village publisher with his last major reading before the assassination Malcolm X. After the assassination, Jones would leave his family, distance himself from the white Beat Poets, and relocate to Harlem transforming himself into Black Nationalist Amiri Baraka. Archive 06-30-2011

The assassinations, violence, and polarization of 1968 hadn't happened, and the hippies were exploring spirituality and social justice. Danny Goldberg takes us back to 1967, to the music, the acid, Jefferson Airplane, Allen Ginsburg, Black Power, and Muhammad Ali. He is the author of How the Left Lost Teen Spirit and Bumping into Geniuses: MY Life Inside the Rock and Roll Business. 1900: Peace Talks Radio: The Series on Peacemaking and Nonviolent Conflict Resolution: [Podcaster's website](#) ; [Underwriter website](#) PEACE TALKS RADIO host Paul Ingles tells the story of losing a friend to a domestic homicide and wanting to explore efforts to help young people learn the building blocks for experiencing healthy relationships as adults. Researchers say those who turn into stalkers and jealous, violent lovers often experience abuse as children and have limited positive role models for good relationships. Paul talks with two people involved in developing programs for schools that help youngsters learn how relationship conflict can be handled and how relationship breakups can be managed and survived without turning to violence. David Wolfe co-developed a program called "The Fourth R" in which "Relationship" joins the traditional "reading, 'riting, and 'rithmetic" in middle and high school training. Alexandra Smith oversees a program called "Start Strong Bronx" in New York that makes use of "The Fourth R" curriculum in middle schools. Archive 12-24-2018

Then we check out a surprise studio performance by legendary Pacifica programmer Julius Lester - previously best-known for his insightful late 1960's interviews of Muhammad Ali, June Jordan, and Vincent Harding among others - but perhaps also to be known in the future for this striking rendition of the folk classic Stagger Lee. Finally, we settle down to an interview with writer Walter Mosley following the 1997 release of Always Outnumbered, Always Outgunned, which introduces the character Socrates Forthlow - who encourages young readers to think about the consequences of their decisions.
