of his 1962 novel *Something Wicked This Way Comes*. This talk is appropriately called *The World of Ray Bradbury* as he clearly traces the motivation for his unique writing style from his childhood to the present. In this next speech delivered at the International Colloquium on Mars in December 1973, Bradbury reflects on the literary and visionary masters before him that inspired him as a child to dream.
